Conditioning fuels Quakers strong wrestling start

The wrestling team at Lansing Eastern represents four different continents, carries an Academic All-State 3.5 grade point average and is one of the early season surprises in the Capital Area Activities Conference Blue Division.

The Quakers opened a few eyes with a conference opening win over perennial league wrestling power Holt and with a third-place finish at the Don Johnson Wrestling Invitational.

"You win in December on conditioning and that has been huge for us against Holt and with our fast start," said Lansing East wrestling coach Adam Fedewa.

Fedewa's Quakers are a junior-laden club whose fast start is matched only by its ability to quickly pick up what the coach is teaching.

Good and scary may land the Quakers in the Breslin Center

It's fitting that Lansing Eastern, one of the Capital Area Activities Conferences "scary good" boys basketball teams, has the the "Boo Man" playing for it.

Frederick "Boo Man" Edmond, the Quaker senior wing/guard averages 25 points a game and still scares opponents with his dunks.

"Out guard play is our strength. They are interchangeable. Most of our guards can go to the post, grab double-figure rebounds and run the point and the wing," said Lansing Eastern boys basketball coach Rod Watts.

Lansing Eastern finished second a year ago to Okemos and East Lansing in the Blue Division. It's run in the state tournament ended with a regional final loss to Kalamazoo Central.

This year the Quaker's sights are set on reaching the Breslin Center.

"These guys have one more year under their belt, they are hungry, They understand the sense of urgency. It's a group that is doing it together,

for they understand the importance to give of one self for the team," Watts explained.

While the Quakers have many who can play the point position, Watts believes Cha Cha Tucker stands out as one of the best in the state.

Playing on the floor with him at any one time will be senior Amari George (averaging 20 points per game), the team's top defender Brian Morton, and senior Darryl Thompson.

"We can have have a different leading scorer every night. These guys share the ball well," Watts said.

Snatching rebounds and putting a body on people for the Quakers is 6-5 center Anthony Campbell.

So who's the favorite to win arguably the best basketball conference in the state?

"If you're asking me? My favorite team is us," Watts reveals. "These guys have chemistry. They share the ball well which is supported by the all their assists and they all chip in and give their all."

“We also have a number of kids with some God-given athletic ability,” Fedewa adds. “This group has come into its own big time and that is exciting.”

Lansing Eastern is led by state qualifier Elijah Dennis (160).

Aaron David, 125, also qualified for the state tourney a year ago. Luis Labaut fell one match short of qualifying for the state tournament at 103 pounds last year. He’s wrestling at 112 in 2011-12.

Autumn Rox, wrestling at 152, won the Women’s Cadet Nationals in Fargo in lead-up to the season.

Juaquin Sanchez finished second wrestling at 130 pounds in the Johnson tourney.

There are six Quaker wrestlers who entered the season with a 4.0 grade point average. They are Sanchez, Rox, Charles Janes (119), Jerek Crim (171), Jon Sarmiento (171) and Jeffrey Mills (215).

The remaining weight classes are filled by Diego Molina (135), Khalil Perkins (140), Guibenson St. Jean, Haiti, (152) and Travis Stouffer (HWT).

Lansing Eastern has not won a league title since 1998.
