Waverly boys hope the mixture of big and quick bring Gold championship

Who won the Red Division of the Capital Area Activities Conference Gold Division last year?

If you said Lansing Sexton you'd be half right.

If you said the Big Reds and the Warriors from Lansing, Waverly move to the front of the class.

The Warriors being moved into the Gold Division will prevent that from happening this year.

Waverly coach Craig Fields will miss the opportunity to play the defending Class B State Champions.

"Definitely (miss playing Sexton) and that's all I will say about the division change," Fields explained.

Coming off a 16-5 season a year ago, and having completed its December slate at 3-0, Waverly is an early season odds-on-favorite to win the Gold Division. That's not to say it won't encounter challenges from Mason, Charlotte and Eaton Rapids.

"We're a work in progress and the boys are getting better every day. If they stick it out and continue to improve we're going to be pretty good by season's end," Fields said.

The coach and his Warriors have been helped to their fast start by the return of 2010-11 starters Rashaun Carroll (guard) and Jordan Martin (forward).

Filling out the starting rotation are seniors Louis Brown (forward), Scott Koenigsknecht (center) and junior Dee Roberts (guard).

"Last year we had three big men. This year we're quicker and faster and have one big man," Fields said. "Things have changed a lot, however, I'm pleased with our effort, execution and we're still getting better."

The three weeks over the holidays, Fields spent getting everything in and preparing for the season's long haul and quest for a championship.

Warrior girls early favorites in CAAC Gold Division

It's too early to crown Lansing Waverly's girls' basketball team league champ, but it's clear the Warriors are playing a champion caliber non conference schedule.

Lansing Waverly opened the season with a win over basketball power East Lansing and have dates with defending state champion Inkster and a highly rated St John's club.

Waverly's talent filled roster has not flown under the radar. The Warriors are ranked third in the state by the *Detroit News* and ninth by the *Detroit Free Press*.

A district consisting of DeWitt, Okemos, Lansing Everitt and Lansing Eastern awaits Waverly in the post season.

"It should be good basketball and fun for area fans," said Waverly girls basketball coach Erik Kutas.

Waverly completed its December schedule with a perfect 5-0 record.

"We've won, but have not been playing well. The girls could have easily lost to Charlotte and played poorly in the first half against East Lansing," Kutas said.

With three of its starters signed to play Division I basketball in the fall of 2012 it's hard to imagine Waverly not making a deep run in the post season.

Senior Sylvia Maxwell averages 20 points a game and will play at Niagra when she is finished with high school.

Taylor McKay also signed with Niagra. The senior touts a good pull-up jumper and applies strong on-ball defense.

Jasmine Wood, 6'1", will take her hardwood talents to Akron. She has a good perimeter touch from beyond the arc and displays a good inside presence.

"We have three division I players, but our best player is not committed," explains Kutas.

That would be junior Victoria Milton. "She's our heart and soul and our leader in assists, second leading scorer and sees the floor really well," explains Kutas. "Victoria is a special player."

Waverly's freshman Breanna Mobley may very well be its best athlete, at 6-1 she is a terrific perimeter player.

Danielle Brodberg will also provide an offensive spark off the bench.

Defensively the Warriors will show a variety of presses, keep an up temp and derive much of its offense from transition.

Kutas expects his club to be healthier and in better shape coming out of break. "We want to play that up tempo, press type game the whole game," he said.

The players expected to contribute off the bench is junior Morgan Kelso and senior Rachael Strother.

"We have quite a bit of talent the key will be playing together, playing with consistency and playing hard from start to finish," Kutas concludes.

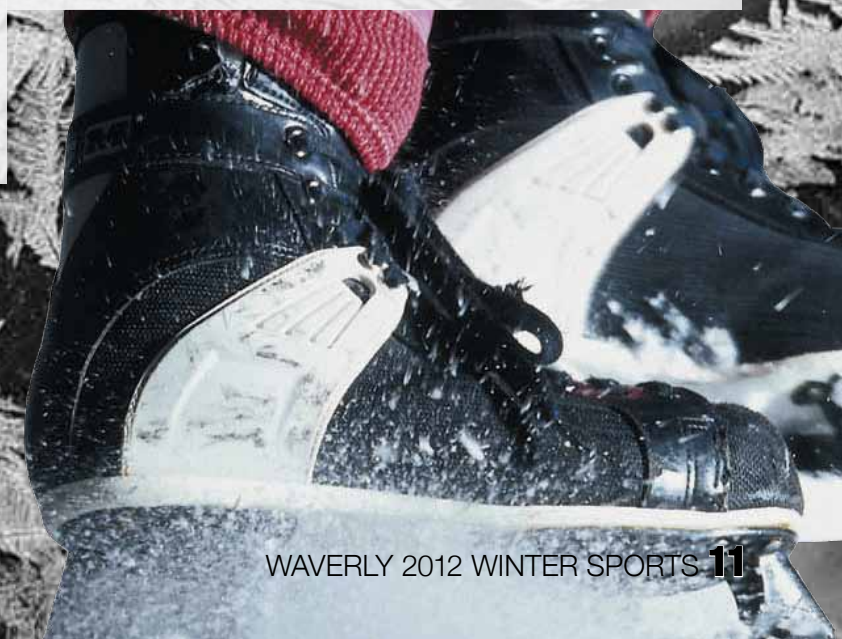

The all-state candidates are Jay Woods (112), Cody Daniels (130), Aaron Mays (152), Thomas Houston (160), and Cameron Lee (215). Going into the holiday break Woods had one loss, Daniels and Houston both won the LWOA tournament, Mays is a defending league and district champion and Lee is a former AAU champion.

The Warriors will compete in the Gold Division of the Capital Area Activities Conference in 2011-12. Gone from the league schedule is St. Johns, however Mason remains with new looks in Charlotte, Eaton Rapids, Dewitt, Ionia, Lumen Christi and Jackson Northwest.

York doesn't believe his squad has enough to knock off Mason, however York says it will be right there vying for second or third.

Waverly swimmers building toward promising future

It was “Back to the Future” for the Waverly boys swim team at the 48th Annual Howard Comstock Waverly Relays.

The Warriors won the 200 butterfly relay and the 400 individual medley relay.

“It’s been over 20 years since we’ve won a relay,” said Lansing Waverly’s swim coach, Dave Hill.

While two firsts at a relay does not make a season, it may hint at a program building toward big things in the future.

“We’re in the middle of the road but building toward big things over the next couple of years,” Hill said. “We have freshmen who are going to make big contributions and we have experience. I have some boys who know how to swim.”

The freshmen are Brad Garmyn (breast) and Andy Dobias (freestyle).

Bringing experience are Ben Rentz, a state qualifier in the 100 butterfly as a sophomore and junior captains Tommy Quinn and Kevin Rubino.

It is anticipated Quinn will qualify for state in the butterfly while Rubino will look to improve on his conference champion status in the freestyle.

“We’re good at the top end of the lineup but have some depth issues,” Hill explained. Depth is what

Hill believes will separate his Warriors from the Capital Area Activities Conference Gold Division’s top teams, Mason and Owosso. “They have power up front and depth.” As we gain experience we’re hoping to make some noise,” Hill said.

Waverly returns six starters from last year, but will feature many new swimmers. “We’ll win some events, but are going to have to pick up some second and third places along the way,” Hill said.

The Warrior coach worked his club hard over the break, using that time to figure out what is the best event for each guy.

The goal will be to win some meets along the way in preparation for the conference and state meets.
